CURRICULUM

- 1. Approval was given to confirm the employment of Dr. Perry Zirkel, consultant, to prepare and present a workshop entitled, "The 'New' Section 504 Training," on September 20, 2012, at a cost not to exceed \$3,400.
- 2. Approval was given to purchase Teachscape's "Framework for Teaching Proficiency System" Annual User licenses for a cost not to exceed \$7,980. This online professional development series results in administrators receiving Evaluator Certification in their knowledge of the Danielson Framework for Teaching and in their observation skills. Funds to be allocated from the Race to the Top Grant III.

3. Approval was given to purchase Teachscape's "Individual Teacher Danielson Framework for Teaching Effectiveness Series" licenses for a cost not to exceed \$17,750. This series of eight video-based modules will explore the eight observable components in Domains 2 and 3 of Danielson's Framework for Teaching and serve as the core of the professional development program focused on preparing teachers for the implementation of TEACHNJ. Funds to be allocated from NCLB Title II-A.

- 4. Approval was given to purchase Teachscape's "Reflect Live" Individual User licenses at a cost not to exceed \$2,445. This software will allow the District to pilot a shift from traditional paper forms to a technology-enabled observation management and reporting system. The pilot will occur at the Francis A. Desmares School during the 2012-2013 school year, and if successful may result in a recommendation to adopt the software for all teachers and administrators.
- 5. Approval was given to employ Teachscape to prepare and present a one-day workshop entitled, "Using Reflect Live" to the administrative team during the 2012-2013 school year at a cost of \$3,500. Funds to be allocated from NCLB Title II-A and Race to the Top III.

The total cost of implementation of professional development and software associated with the teacher evaluation reform initiative is \$43,525 (includes expenses previously approved by the Board of Education). The only expense anticipated to reoccur is the cost of training new teachers and administrators in the future. In addition, if the District elects to adopt Teachscape's Reflect Live Observation Tool after the Desmares Pilot, then an annual reoccurring cost of \$45 per user would be incurred. Previous presentations to the Board on this topic have included the "NCLB Waiver Approval: What Does it Mean for Us" on February 27, 2012, and the "Teacher Evaluation Framework Selection Committee Report" on September 24, 2012. In addition, the Board Curriculum Committee reviewed the components and costs in detail at their October 3, 2012 meeting.

Ms. Fallon asked why Flemington-Raritan School District was not in the consortium. Mr. Nolan stated the district was not in because we selected our model after the consortium. We used a committee, as well as, did a very thorough investigation. Mr. Bland reviewed the costs. Mr. Davidson noted these are all grant funds. Dr. Bonieski reviewed the items to be purchased.
