CONCUSSION CARD



SYMPTOMS REPORTED BY ATHLETE:

- ♦ Headache or "pressure" in head
- ♦ Nausea or Vomiting
- ♦ Balance problems or dizziness
- Sensitivity to light and noise
- ◆ Feeling slugglish, hazy, foggy, or groggy
- ♦ Concentration or memory problems
- ♦ Confusion
- Just not "feeling right" or is "feeling down"

SIGNS OBSERVED BY COACHING STAFF:

- ♦ Appears days or stunned
- ♦ Is confused about assignment or position
- ♦ Unsure of game, score, or opponent
- Answers questions slowly
- ◆ Loses consciousness (even briefly)
- ♦ Shows mood, behavior, or personality changes
- ◆ Can't recall events prior to hit or fall
- ♦ Can't recall events after hit or fall

IF YOU SUSPECT THAT AN ATHLETE HAS A CONCUSSION, YOU SHOULD TAKE THE FOLLOWING STEPS:

- 1. Remove the athlete from activity
- 2. Keep the athlete out of play the day of the injury.
- 3. Obtain permission from an appropriate health care professional that states the athlete can return to play.
- 4. Keep the athlete out of play the day of the injury and until a health care professional, experienced in evaluating for concussion, says that they are
