- ~We completed <u>A LOT</u> of testing this week. Students completed three sections of the NWEA MAP test. Additionally, students were given individual assessments by me to determine their current reading levels.
- ~We looked for the Word of the Week: **and** in our books and poems
- ~We still had some time for Literacy Centers where we:
 - practiced writing CVC words
 - practiced reading and writing the word "and"
 - ordered the letters in the alphabet
 - listened to stories of our choosing and shopped for books for our book bins
- ~We enjoyed finishing our latest books about our favorite color. We are working on stretching our words and our thoughts, using multiple sentences, and applying mechanics such as spelling high frequency words correctly, using appropriate spacing and ending punctuation.
- ~In Fundations we began our second unit. We are tapping out consonant-vowel-consonant (or CVC) words and we are learning how to properly write our uppercase letters. We are practicing ABC order and we've been creating rhyming words.
- ~We are really working to hone our Phonemic Awareness skills. We've been: producing rhyming words, blending and segmenting words, identifying initial and medial sounds, and changing parts of words to create new words.
